Under the auspices of BQAC, M.S.S & Aquaculture & Eco-club of Govt. Degree College Avanigadda. Faculty & Students visited the Turtle-Conservation hatchery maintained by the Forest Department near the Sagarasungamam in Palakurthy, Hippa, Boduru (M) Krishna Dist. A.P.

The Forest Dept. is responsible for collecting and storing turtle eggs, protecting baby turtles from danger after 45 days, and carefully releasing them into the sea. The forest department officer F.B. Vuli said that they have been operating this work since 2015.

Faculty & Students have been cooperating with the forest department in releasing the baby turtle cubs bravely. He said the turtle did not take food immediately after birth, but had enough food for three days at the bottom, until it settled into the sea and settled down.

He said that now from where we are releasing them into the sea they will come back to the same area again after 15 years and lay eggs.
